Removal of Worn Treads

CAUTION

Be careful when removing treads not to scratch chrome components.

- Place narrow pry bar or screw driver between rubber tread and footpeg casting. Peel tread away from footpeg casting. Take care not to damage adhesive/locator pins cast underneath tread.
- Scrape away residual rubber, adhesive and debris from all surfaces.
- 3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 for all treads requiring replacement prior to installing new treads.

Installation

- Determine location and orientation of each replacement tread.
- Apply a conservative amount of adhesive (included in kit) to the bottom side and hole of tread. If too much adhesive is used, it will ooze out from under tread and cause an unsightly mess!
- 3. Place tread in proper location of footpeg casting and apply pressure sufficient for it to fully seat on pins. (Press hard directly over each pin.)
- 4. Repeat for all treads on a single peg.
- 5. Apply constant pressure to treads to properly bond.

NOTE

One method is to tightly wrap the footpeg with duct tape. Prior to wrapping, place something between the footpeg and tape so it does not leave a residue on the footpeg (A large piece of duct tape folded onto itself works well.)

- 6. Allow adhesive to cure for 24 hrs.
- 7. Remove tape.
